I imagine it is heartbreaking for all involved when parents love their children enough to uproot their entire lives and start over completely in a foreign land, only for those children to grow up and think of them as backwards and out of touch. My husband and I, who were both raised in church-going families, had drifted away from the church for a variety of reasons, but when our children grew in age and awareness, I knew we had to root them in our culture, or risk losing them to the world and its false promises.
