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

Mark 8:27-9:8

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi, and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they answered him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

He called the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see that the kingdom of God has come with power."

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling bright, such as no one on earth could brighten them. And there

appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us set up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.



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LITURGICAL ART

First Presbyterian Church follows the liturgical calendar to mark the seasons of our life together as Christians. We are currently in the season of Epiphany, also known as Ordinary Time, which lasts from Epiphany on January 6 to Ash Wednesday, February 14. The color GREEN symbolizes the promise of new life and spiritual growth. The Celtic Cross hanging on the dossal was designed and carved by Dr. Richard Deerhake and Dr. Emil Ziegler, dedicated in memory of Thomas L. Clancey and Jacob P. Deerhake. The dossal and pulpit and lectern paraments have overlay panels of vines, symbolizing growth in the Spirit. The banners above the doors, left and right portray the Sacraments of the church, Baptism on the left with a shell and water poured out, and Holy Communion on the right, with wheat and grapes. Both banners have a circle symbolizing God, the Eternal One, and open Bibles symbolizing the Word of God. On the right banner is Chi Rho, the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ. On the left banner are Alpha and Omega, the first and last letters in Greek, signifying the beginning and the ending. Artist Don Beck, whose creative vision continues to shape worship at FPC, has been formative in creating the visual elements of our liturgy.
