


All eligible families are welcome to come explore the great opportunity our Nursery School offers. Scholarship help is available!

FPC Nursery School Registration/Open House

Tuesday, February 20 at 7:00pm in Fellowship Hall.

Children who will be 3 or 4 by August 1 are eligible.



Our Nursery School is up and running again following the damage from the water. Due to quick thinking and action only a minimal number of supplies/books were actually lost, and the office is in the process of being rebuilt. A wall has been constructed to protect the students from construction and the teachers have helped all our students feel safe in this time.





At its February meeting, the Session approved asking the congregation to begin building a Scholarship Fund for our Nursery School. Currently four families are using scholarships and the funds for those will run out before the end of the current year. The immediate need is for \$422 per month (\$1732). High quality preschool education is deeply beneficial to students who start Kindergarten much better prepared, so this is a solid investment in our community's future. If you would like to contribute toward this permanent fund, please note 'nursery school scholarships' on your check. You can also give through online and note 'NS Scholarships.'

- -Repaired the hot water heater.
- -An air handler unit coil froze and caused hot water to spray for hours over-night, causing damage to room 214 and the preschool office and hallways. Repairs to these areas are underway.
- -A temporary wall has been built in the preschool to separate the construction area from the children.
- -The Cylinder has been replaced in the Fellowship Hall Dishwasher.
- -A backflow in the boiler room was leaking into the Great Room kitchen. It has been rebuilt and installed.
- -We have purchased 36-60'' round tables for the great Room. They are lightweight and much easier to do quick tear downs and set-ups! The old tables will be relocated upstairs in the Fellowship Hall table closet.



Godly Play During Lent

What is a miracle? Who was Jesus, really? How do the events of antiquity relate to our present times?

There are so many important questions central to our faith, ones which all serious Christians must be willing to ponder. Rather than give our children pat answers that extinguish their curiosity about our God, our world, and our place in the Story, Godly Play invites young hearts and minds to engage with big questions, encouraging an attitude of wonder to carry throughout our lives.

In the three years I've been leading Godly Play, we've focused on the relationship between God and God's People (the record of love and forgiveness that it is!), and Jesus' message to us as laid out in his parables and rhetoric. This Lent in Godly Play we'll be exploring, for the first time, the stories of some of the miracles are invitatified to Jesus. For the first five weeks, we'll hear and considering at home.

(Matthew 8:23-27), his ability to heal (Mark 5:23-41 and Luke 5:17-26), the provision of his abundance (John 6:1-4), and his calling forth life from death (John 11:38-44). We'll wonder together what a miracle is (and isn't), what it says about the person performing them, what it means for those receiving them, those who witness them, and whether miracles still happen today.

Palm Sunday will be a retelling of the events of the week leading up to his crucifixion, and, perhaps the biggest miracle of them all, his subsequent resurrection. We hope you and your children (and grandchildren!) can be present to explore these very special stories. As we say in Godly Play, they are, indeed, strange and amazing

Families are invited to continue the conversations and the wondering at home.


February 20-March 19: Join us each
