

for fun. All ages welcome!




INSTRUMENTALISTS WELCOME



New sidewalks and curbs in areas have been completed.

The new concrete pad in front of the dumpster will be completed after the new chiller arrives. The Columbarium area concrete will start when there is a period of dry weather. This will help protect the ground from their equipment.

The new chiller has arrived but has not yet begun installation.

Installation will begin June 3. This means the '05 addition and the sanctuary will be without chilled water to cool the building.



We anticipate 3-4 weeks until installation is complete and AC is fully on.

The fire inspection for the new fire system, will take place sometime in June. We will have a week's notice. The fire alarm will be activated for approximately 1 hour during that time. I will inform groups that may be affected by this with as much notice as possible.

Following the concrete project, the resurfacing of the back drive area will take placethen sealing of the parking lot will follow.

The Gardens have been tilled and the water has been turned on. Gardeners are actively planting and tending their plots.






